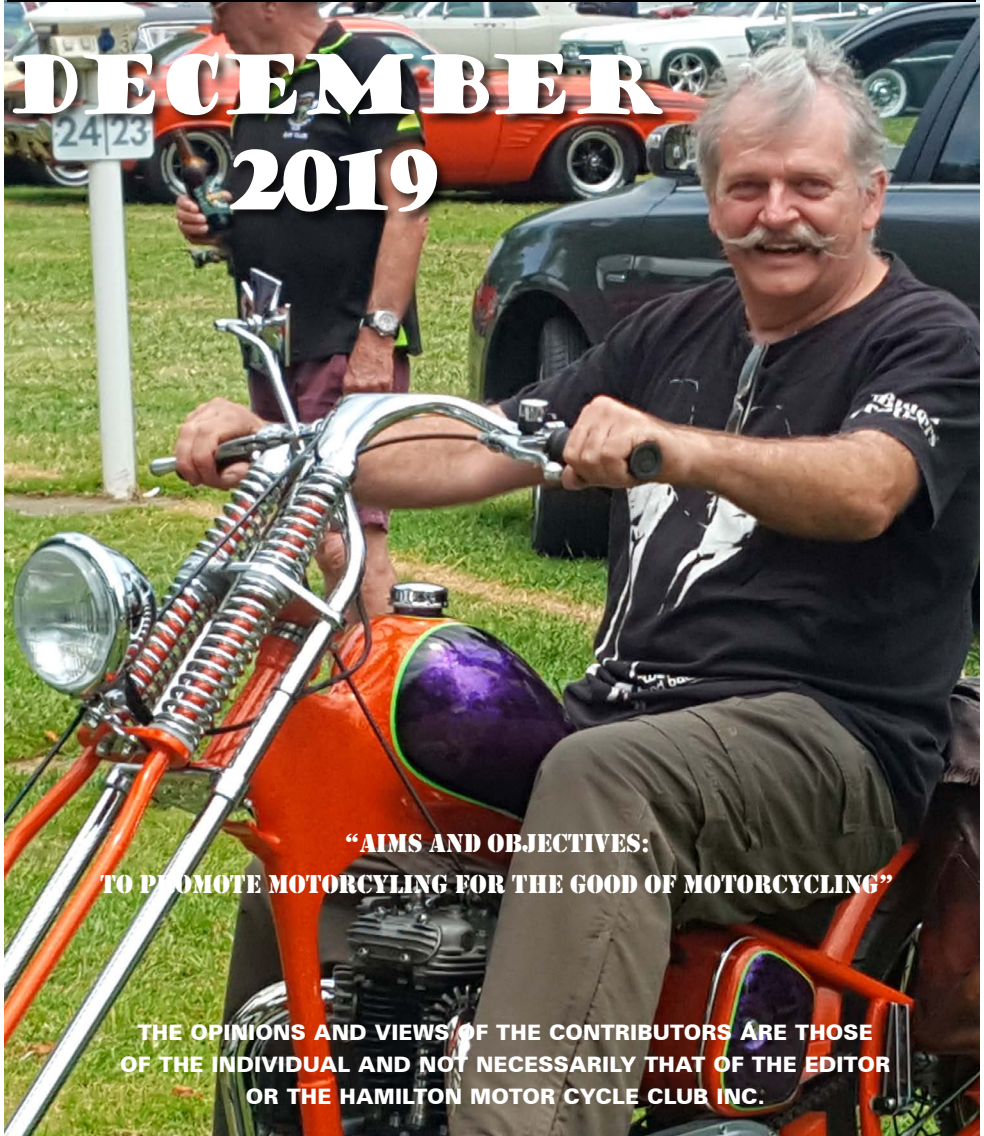

The next section across the hills was pretty rough, and while twisty doesn't have the same rhythm, but still fun anyway. Eventually after far too long between stops, we roll into the characterful Port Waikato, as shown above. Did manage to get a couple of ring ins in the carpark to make the photo look better, but no I cannot lie, it was still just us three old farts.

Amazing to see the erosion out there, the landscape is really changing.

We decided Tuakau was more civilised for lunch, especially on 3 thirsty twins with small tanks, we weren't going to get much further without fuel.

Then back across the river at Mercer, and down the east side of the river, crossing the new expressway several times - progressing along well it is.

# Jordan Burley Race Season 2019/20



With Suzuki Series just around the corner I thought it was time to give everyone an update of where we are at and what our plans are for this season.

This year we will be back in the SuperSport600 paddock after our not so amazing debut last season. It was a season we would rather forget with three mechanical failures before the end of NZSBK Round 2 and then a broken arm while testing ahead of round 3 which ended the season.

There were some highlights to build on though with a Top 15 in the Robert Holden Memorial at Whanganui on Boxing day and regular Top 10 finishes in all the races we attended (including on someone else's bike down at Levels for NZSBK Round 2!).

The Triumph has been offloaded and this year we will be astride Lance Goodgers Kawasaki ZX6R. Lance is from north of the Bombays (not too far though) and it will be his second year running a bike in the NZSBK series. We are grateful to have the opportunity to ride this bike which has been freshly built over winter (and still getting tweaked).

Hopefully the Japanese quality shines through and we can focus more on speed this season rather than simply keeping it running.

The lead in time for this season has been short with my first ride on the bike only just over a month ago at Pukekohe (Cool track, never ridden there before).

Since then we have made it to two more test days and the last round of the AMCC series at Hampton Downs just a couple of weeks ago.

Things are looking promising with some good close racing at Hampton Downs and a new PB. We've also been having our share of teething issues as you can expect with a fresh build (brake fade after two laps at full race pace was just a minor one) and there is still plenty to be learnt. Next up we are straight into the Suzuki Series with Taupo this coming weekend 7-8th December.

The Suzuki Series are two day events this year (except Whanganui) with Practice, Qualifying and Race 1 on the Saturday followed by two further races on Sunday. This should be good with less rush to get through the day and a better warm up for nationals.

The fields in all classes are looking strong with HMCC club members represented in most of them. Come along and check it out some great racing. The following weekend 14-15th is down in Fielding at Manfield and then the traditional finish at Whanganui for the street race on Boxing Day.

From there we get a short break before the NZSBK series kicks off down at Ruapuna in Christchurch on the 12th-13th of January. As always, for those of you who can't make it in person all these events will be streamed live for free by the legendary team at CTAS on ctaslive.co.nz.

There is also a connection with SkySport this year so you may even see us on TV!

I would like to thank those supporting us this season including Raglan Resthome and Hospital, Handy Rentals Hamilton, Bridgestone, LS2, Gaerne, F1 Engineering, Nitron/Kiwi Suspension Solutions, Putoline, RK, Oxford and of course my amazing and supportive partner Hazel.

Suzuki International Series set for summer scorcher  
Days are being counted down as New Zealand's road-racing community braces itself for the start of the high-profile Suzuki International Series.

It is certainly going to be another scorching summer of motorcycling this year with December's annual Suzuki International Series road-race competition again swamped with potent, world-class entries and even the re-vamped GIXXER Cup class boasts 25 riders in its line-up so far.

The 2019 edition of the always-popular three-round series is set to kick off at Taupo's Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park on December 7-8 and so will begin three consecutive weeks of blistering motorbike action.

Manfeild, on the outskirts of Feilding, follows as host venue a week after the Taupo round, on December 14-15, and the action wraps up, as it traditionally does, on the public streets of Whanganui, the world-famous Cemetery Circuit, on Boxing Day (Thursday, December 26).

Taupo's Scott Moir will be hoping to take his Suzuki GSX-R1000 to a third consecutive outright win in the Formula One (F1) class in this year's Suzuki International Series, but he knows he'll again have his work cut out just staying ahead of fellow Suzuki stars Sloan Frost and Daniel Mettam, not to mention all the other "big names" that will be lining up.

Wellington's Frost is a two-time former national superbike champion and won the Suzuki International Series F1 class in 2015, while Glen Eden's Mettam is this year's national superbike champion.

But Moir, the Suzuki International Series champion in the glamour F1 class in both 2017 and 2018, remains steadfastly confident.

"I'm feeling strong and fast, I'm the fittest I've ever been and I certainly believe I can win," said Moir, a 36-year-old father-of-two.

"It's going to be tough, but I'm up for the fight."

Mettam is similarly bullish about his chances of winning the series.

"I'd love to win the Suzuki International Series. I have the national superbike title, but it would be so nice to have the F1 Suzuki Series crown as well. I won the 600cc (F2) class in the Suzuki Series in 2015, but the F1 title is the main one," said the 23-year-old Mettam.

"The international riders who are coming will certainly be fast, but I think we Kiwis may have a slight advantage over them because we know the tracks already.

"I'm feeling really good with my preparations and we are nearly 100 percent with tyres and suspension settings now."

The Suzuki International Series is New Zealand's richest motorcycle competition and it has again attracted a huge overseas contingent, with top riders arriving from the United Kingdom, France and Australia, including Isle of Man and British Superbike Championship winners among them.

British rider Richard Cooper, Ireland's Lee Johnston are the main draw-card entrants this year, with many race fans sure to already know of their incredible international exploits.

Cooper is the British Superbike Championships (BSB) Superstock Champion for 2019 and his performance as a newcomer at this year's North West 200 was a definite highlight of that iconic event.

He will race in New Zealand for the Sloan Frost Motorsport Team.

Johnston is the 2019 Isle of Man TT winner, icing on a cake to his 2019 season that also saw him win the Scarborough Gold Cup and finish runner-up in the Ulster GP.

Frenchman Morgan Govignon will be here too, set to race in the Bears (non-Japanese bikes) class.

And there is also certainly no shortage of Kiwi talent.

Wainuiomata's Shane Richardson returns from overseas, where he featured at the front this year in the British Superbike Championships, racing in the superstock class. He will race in the F1 class in the Suzuki International Series.

Christchurch's Alastair Hoogenboezem and Whakatane's Rees brothers – Mitch and Damon – will also be pushing for top honours in the F1 class.

Wellington's Glen Skachill returns to racing after a number of years away and he will also add spark to the F1 class, while reigning national 600 Supersport champion Avalon Biddle has delighted organisers with news that she will race the Suzuki International Series and make her debut on the public streets of Whanganui on Boxing Day.

Rangiora-based Kiwi international Biddle will race in the F2 (600cc) class.

The Suzuki International Series also offers races for Formula Three, Classics (pre-89), sports bikes, super motard bikes and sidecars, so there's no shortage of on-track action.

The crowd-favourite GIXXER Cup class, reserved for riders on identical 150cc Suzuki GSX150F model bikes, is in the programme again this year with the rider age-limit restriction lifted, meaning individuals such as Frost, Mettam and Christchurch's Dennis Charlett are expected also to line up and give talented youngsters such as Jesse Stroud (Hamilton) and Caleb Gilmore (Whanganui) something to really think about.

The GIXXER competition, hatched in late 2017 as a nursery ground for motorcycle road-racing – and with the catch-phrase ‘Growing Future Champions’ – has truly been an outstanding success.

Numerous young riders, many of whom who would perhaps previously not even have considered tackling the sport, have now embraced racing and are showing signs that they indeed could be superbike champions in years to come.

While the sport’s purists will perhaps still focus on what’s happening in categories such as the 1000cc F1 superbike or 600cc F2 bike classes, for example, there is no denying that some of the closest and most exciting racing witnessed in the Suzuki Series (Suzuki International Series) last season was in the GIXXER Cup.

In addition to all of this, members of the public can save money by purchasing “early bird tickets” through Ticketek on-line and then they’ll also go in the draw to win a Suzuki GIXXER150 bike.

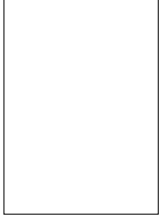
