Interclub Challenge:

AMCC-HMCC



Something a bit different for the coming 2020-21 season is the Battle Of The Clubs. An Interclub Challenge involving AMCC and HMCC – whereby a Round from each Club's respective Club Series will count towards the Battle Of The Clubs points.

Round 2 of the AMCC Series (at HD on 18 October) will be the first Round
And Round 2 of the HMCC Series (at Taupo on 8 November) will be the second and Final Round.

Points for the Battle Of The Clubs are independent of individual Club Series points. However it is a great opportunity for a bit of interclub fun and engagement, and some more track time. For more details, see the Entry Forms (on the AMCC Website), or email roadrace@amcc.org.nz and they will address any queries or questions.

BATTLE OF THE CLUBS (AMCC, HMCC)

There is no restriction of the grade of rider or capacity of machine unless for reasons of safety as deemed by the Race Secretary or CoC or failure to comply with Machine Specifications and event.

Supplementary Regulations. Riders within the Sidecar and Supermoto classes are excluded from the points. Each club member that competes will still retain their club points. However, each club's member's points will also be added to the club's Battle of the Clubs tally. The tally will then determine the overall winner for the series.

For each rider that attends an "away meeting", their points will be doubled in the tally. At the end of each round, the tallies will be totalled and averaged based on the number of riders who have competed from each club.

This is only eligible for Auckland Motorcycle Club and Hamilton Motorcycle Club members, any competitors from other clubs may enter the Battle of the Clubs but purchasing a club membership from either club they wish to represent. Failure to comply with the MoMs or supplementary regulations will result in the rider losing their points for that race. This decision will be at the discretion of the race officials with at least one member from each club.

AMCC hosted Round will be held at Hampton Downs Motorsport Park during AMCC Club round 2 on 18 October 2020.
HMCC hosted Round will be held at Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park during HMCC Club final round on 8 November 2020 followed by prizegiving for the trophy will be done at the completion of the day.

Centenary Series Round 1 Report

A test of patience

A one in 10 year weather bomb they reckoned on throwing at us for round 1 at Taupo. It was looking pretty much so as everyone arrived and unloaded. A few riders already missing, taking heed of the weather warnings, but the hardy optimists turned up just in case.

Practice was due to start at 9, but conditions were assessed as too dangerous, so we all stayed huddled in the garages watching sideways rain blow down the start finish straight. Another review at 10 saw no improvement, and by 11 quite a few had left, and we considered calling it all off, as a few more had packed up and departed. But better conditions were predicted, so the optimists stayed, and the rain eased up.

So to assist in track drying, the gates were opened for a mass cruise in our cars, utes, vans, ambulance and even a bus. Not sure if it helped the track much but it sure relieved the boredom!

With the sky clearing to blue, practice /qualifying was called around midday, to run on track 2 for all classes to keep the schedule as short as possible. The sun and wind dried the track so fast most of the first session riders had an almost dry track under their rain tyres! Practice round went off without a hitch, so Race 1 was called up in great conditions on a dry track.

Junior class first, a somewhat reduced field (as were all classes) lined up with 300 Ninja mounted Shaun Parker on his first ever pole position. Didn't do him much good as he fluffed it and was pretty much last 50 meters later. But confident braking into turn one had him heading into T2 in second, chasing down Chris Smith on a 400 Ninja. By turn 4 Shaun had reclaimed first place, and held it all the way to the final turn, however Chris overcooked it a little, and Shaun managed to out drag him to the finish line by .173 of a second, and his first ever win to what was turning out to be a great weekend for him.

Next up was Post Classics, which turned into an epic battle between Mark Hatton (PC Senior class FZR1000) and Kerry Chapman (PC Junior class TZR250). A race long battle ensued, with Mark making the most of the power advantage to take the win.

Intermediate/Supermoto class next up, a better size field, but a bit of a Nick Kampenhout benefit, with the best of the Motards, Will Young (CRF250) coming in a few seconds behind him.

Seniors still had a good few runners. Tarbon Walker (ZXR600) got the holeshot, and looked pretty sharp in the lead. But Jaden Hassan's big BMW soon hauled him in, to win by almost 10 seconds.

Second round soon underway with the Juniors, Shaun again getting a less than stellar start, the lead out of T1 was Chris Smith followed by 15 year old Isaac Markham-Barrett (KTM RC390) with Shaun in 3rd. In the 4th lap Shaun moved past Isaac, but couldn't do anything about the 5 second gap to Chris this time.

Post Classics pretty much followed the same formula as the first race, Mark Hatton leading Kerry Chapman home again by .193 of second. Praise also to HMCC members Martin Platt (TRX850) in third, and Andrew Boldero in 4th, (Clubman, BMW S1000R, not his little Hyosung!).

Nick Kampenhout (Husqvarna 693) again took a comfortable win from top Motard Will Young.

Senior again saw a fast-starting Tarbon Walker again being overhauled by the bigger BMW of Hassan. Jacob Stroud learning the ropes of his new R6 mount came through in 3rd.

The one sidecar outfit that remained, got some track time here, and despite the late start, we still had time to fit a third round in, although we dropped the lap count to 4 to keep things speedy.

Shaun Parker again followed form, starting slowly and coming into T2 in 3rd behind Chris Smith and Isaac on the KTM. The 3 were lapping in close formation, when Chris has a wee moment at T7, and dropped to third. Shaun closed down on Isaac, and passed for the lead on the third lap, allowing Shaun his second win and overall points lead for the day.

Post Classics was yet another epic tussle between Mark and Kerry, this time Kerry finally held Mark off to cross the finish line .4 sec ahead.

Business as usual in Intermediate, the Nick and Will show.

Final Seniors race was a little different as Jaden Hassan didn't start, leaving Tarbon to take the win from Jacob Stroud.

For the first time in my memory, a road race meeting was completed without a single crash, that's gotta be some sort of record! (Oops I have been corrected, someone toppled over on the grass after running off)

AMCC Round 1 Report

Awesome weekend riding the Auckland club championship on the 20th of September. This round was our first time on the 600 so was really looking forward to seeing how we would go against other fast riders like Tarbon Walker and Co. We also rode the MT07 in intermediate for more track time going into nationals.

The day started off wet and we did not put on wet tyres for either class and decided to start from the back as this was just a weekend to get more comfortable and less about results.

Coming through a 30-rider grid is not easy I tell you and the first corner of each race was definitely spent in the outside half of the tarmac that's for sure. Each race we made up more time on the leaders and came closer to the front. In the second restarted race on the 600 I made a really good start and was just off the back of the lead group on the second lap. I spent the next three laps working harder than a one-armed brick layer in Bagdad and reeling in Tarbon and the leaders. I set the fastest lap of the weekend for a 600 at a 1:08.0 which I was super happy with. We had made changes to dial in the Bridgestone's for that second race and they worked a treat. Highly recommended.

The next race we made a set up change that went the wrong way and spent the whole race like the kid who fell out of that tree, we just weren't in it. We did not go any faster but really happy with the day none the less. Dicing it up with superbikes and some fast 600 boys was great for the confidence on the bike and look forward to more of the same.

The MT07 just went all day and the grip was great. Coming through from the back again was a challenge but a lot of fun and our fastest laps in every race proved we have more pace than I thought we did.

Thanks to my amazing team, Greg, my dad and the boys at Whites for putting a solid motorcycle underneath me with a lot of pace and a great launchpad for the season ahead.

2020 NZSBK - SUPERSPORT 300 RESULTS

The official results of the 2020 New Zealand Supersport 300 championships have now been confirmed.

Auckland's Nathanael Diprose was originally announced as provisional champion in the class, soon after the arrival of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the restrictions that followed, had forced an early end to the series, the competition therefore closed off after the third round of the scheduled five in early March.

The championship was "called" as being complete by the sport's governing body here, Motorcycling New Zealand (MNZ), on April 9.

Runner-up in the Supersport 300 class for 2020 was provisionally listed as Hamilton's Jacob Stroud, with Whangarei's Jason Hearn credited with third place overall.

MNZ is now able to confirm the podium places as approved and correct.

Diprose is therefore declared the 2020 champion in this class, with Stroud runner-up and Hearn third.

The chaos created by COVID-19, as well as some internal failures within MNZ, made the entire process even more difficult that would normally have been expected and MNZ advises that "improvements will be made" before next year's series gets underway.

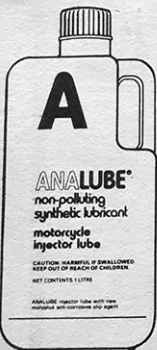

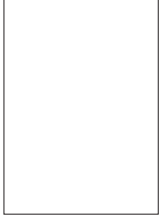
