Interclub Challenge:

AMCC-HMCC



Something a bit different for the coming 2020-21 season is the Battle Of The Clubs.

An Interclub Challenge involving AMCC and HMCC – whereby a Round from each Club's respective Club Series will count towards the Battle Of The Clubs points.

Round 2 of the AMCC Series (at HD on 18 October) will be the first Round

And Round 2 of the HMCC Series (at Taupo on 8 November) will be the second and Final Round.

Points for the Battle Of The Clubs are independent of individual Club Series points.

However it is a great opportunity for a bit of interclub fun and engagement, and some more track time.

For more details, see the Entry Forms (on the AMCC Website), or email roadrace@amcc.org.nz and they will address any queries or questions.

BATTLE OF THE CLUBS (AMCC, HMCC)

There is no restriction of the grade of rider or capacity of machine unless for reasons of safety as deemed by the Race Secretary or CoC or failure to comply with Machine Specifications and event.

Supplementary Regulations. Riders within the Sidecar and Supermoto classes are excluded from the points.

Each club member that competes will still retain their club points. However, each club's member's points will also be added to the club's Battle of the Clubs tally. The tally will then determine the overall winner for the series.

For each rider that attends an "away meeting", their points will be doubled in the tally. At the end of each round, the tallies will be totalled and averaged based on the number of riders who have competed from each club.

This is only eligible for Auckland Motorcycle Club and Hamilton Motorcycle Club members, any competitors from other clubs may enter the Battle of the Clubs but purchasing a club membership from either club they wish to represent.

Failure to comply with the MoMs or supplementary regulations will result in the rider losing their points for that race.

This decision will be at the discretion of the race officials with at least one member from each club.

AMCC hosted Round will be held at Hampton Downs Motorsport Park during AMCC Club round 2 on 18 October 2020.

HMCC hosted Round will be held at Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park during HMCC Club final round on 8 November 2020 followed by prizegiving for the trophy will be done at the completion of the day.

Centenary Series Round 2 Report

Hampton Downs

Not so much work for us running this one, and it doubled as AMCC's Round 2 as well, and they took care of the Admin.

This was the first round of the Inter-Club Challenge, and as expected, there were more riders for AMCC than HMCC, which is where the idea to double the away riders points comes in handy. So handy in fact, that we hold the early lead! However, that could all change at our Round 3, which is AMCC's away round of the Inter Club.

Interclub Challenge Points:

MXTiming have calculated the points (after Round One) for the AMCC/HMCC Interclub Challenge - being based on the total points for which Club the rider ticked to represent.

The "AWAY" Team receives double points.

So that is HMCC - at AMCC's Rd 2 - on Oct 18

AMCC - Total points 2439 divided by 50 riders = 48.78 points

HMCC - Total points 1161 (x2) = 2322 (away club) divided by 27 riders = 86 points

The return Round is with HMCC at Taupo on 8th November,

and AMCC riders will get double points at this event - to determine the overall Challenge winner.

Auckland Motorcycle Club MEDIA RELEASE

In Senior, Jaden Hassan and Tarbon Walker command Formula Auckland and Supersport 600 respectively. Kawasaki mounted David Sharp is right there in the one-litre category, and there is plenty of additional interest across the category.

This includes Zak Fuller – taking the win in Race Four for the 600's; and a healthy complement of Clubman entrants mixing it amongst the NZSBK and Club regulars. Lars Bojsen-Moller heads the Clubman group, aboard his Honda CBR1000RR.

Adam Unsworth & Bryce Rose joined the sidecar field for Round Two, and grabbed three quick wins; with Mark Halls and Geoff Davies taking out race four, and controlling the points lead on their very well-sorted 600 Kawasaki rig.

The 10th Season of Carl Cox Motorsport Cup competition again complements the AMCC schedule, and Jesse Stroud has carried on where he left off last season on the 400 Kawasaki – however Caleb Gilmore was a cat among the pigeons at Round Two; first to the line twice, and posing a stern challenge to the current Ninja champ. On the Hyosung's current champ Loren May has his work cut out also. Back in 4th

in the points, it is Cameron Leslie and Ben Cook setting the pace – just 32 points between them with three rounds to go for this Series.

Intermediate has a diverse grid, with Jesse Stroud leading Supersport 300, but under pressure from Luca Durning and the very fast Caleb Gilmore. Superlite similarly, sees a tense battle between Aaron Dempsey and Fabiano Paiva Santos – just 12 points between the pair.

While in a healthy field of ProTwin 650, Jarad Horn and Jacob Stroud are engaged in an arm-wrestle at the top of the table – with a single non-points result for Stroud being the difference between them. Vaughan Maine holding a handy third overall.

Cameron Leslie and Ben Cook are extending their Carl Cox Motorsport Cup rivalry across to Junior – where in Prolite 250 they are keeping experienced heads Loren May and Scott Findlay at arms-length. The additional track time afforded by cross-entry delivering demonstrable benefit across a range of competitors.

Round Three will conclude the AMCC Club Series at Hampton Downs on Sunday 29th November, while the Carl Cox Motorsport Cup competition will continue with two additional events in the New Year.

Firing Up: Ceramics and the Hamilton Motor Cycle Club

28 November 2020 - 8 February 2021

In the 1920s motorcycle riding was the pastime of the well-heeled adventurer. By the 1960s this had all changed. Riding became associated with youthful counter-culture: hippies and ruffians ruled the roads.

Were Hamilton Motor Cycle Club members ruffians, hippies, or well-heeled adventurers? And why did they assist with the purchase of ceramics for the Waikato Museum Te Whare Taonga o Waikato collection?

In *Firing Up* you can see a selection of works purchased using funds gifted by the Club during the 1970s - including Barry Brickell's 'Cylindrical Pots' - and learn a little about the history of Hamilton's 'motorcycle grand prix'.

This exhibition is curated in honour of the centenary of the Hamilton Motor Cycle Club.

Once again a highly motivated group of riders were given the benefit of Jules's knowledge of the key aspects of keeping your feet up while negotiating the obstacles of a trials section.

Body position is extremely important as the bike often weighs less than the rider. From knees to elbows and shoulders, it is obvious, once explained, where they should be in any given situation.

All you have to do is remember where and when, plus the throttle, clutch and brakes, and you will be scoring cleans all day.

Of course, fitness does help, and practice makes perfect. As always, an expert makes it look easy.

NZ Moto Trials Championships 2020

Four tired Waikato Trials riders sit and reflect a weekend of competition at the Marlborough Motorcycles NZ Moto Trials Championships, here in Canterbury, late afternoon on Labour day.

The 3 days of competition took place at 3 different venues close to Little River on the Banks peninsula. There are some sublime properties for Moto Trials in this area and we were treated once again, in 2020, to a wonderful array of terrain and challenges set out and administered by the Pioneer MCC. The hills were steep and grippy and mostly strewn with rocks while the creeks were challenging with every size of boulder imaginable, but mostly grippy by comparison to what we find at some of our Waikato venues. Sixty-nine competitors from throughout NZ fought battles with the terrain and obstacles in the congenial fashion that is prevalent in our sport.

Temperatures on Saturday and Sunday caused competitors to wilt a little in contrast to the cooler and dampish Monday which suited the author better and reduced dust levels.

Each rider entered the "fray" with their own personal "battles", and it was interesting to watch our top three expert riders launch themselves and their bikes at the seemingly impossible "obstacles" and most often conquer the challenge with precision and courage.

It was good to see Warren Laugesen from Hawkes Bay back to his old superior form but although he pushed our "whiz-kid", Dylan Ball to "the wire" he had to settle for runner up to Dylan. Jules Huguenin from Pioneer came in a creditable third for the weekend.

Hannah Rushworth from Manawatu showed "how its done" in the Womens class, and also to more than half of her male counterparts, while major sponsor Brendon Wadsworth from Marlborough Motorcycles managed top spot in the Presidents class and Simon Jones the Twin Shock class. Brad Hibbs, Ross Bristol and Warwick Merriman won their respective support classes. Well done all.

Waikato riders to gain podium finishes were Peter Osborne achieving 3rd in the President class and Jim Henderson a 2nd in the Twin Shock class.

The highlight of the event for me was the comraderie, enthusiasm and skill levels of the newly formed "minis" that contested this, and recent, NZ Moto Trials champs. These youngsters, on their predominantly electric powered motorcycles, impressed in every way with their sportmanship, ability and enthusiasm. I wont mention winners because in my view they are all winners but as a senior Moto Trials rider I would like to sincerely welcome the Burns, Furness, Pearce, Treloar, Herbert, Jones, Hubbard, Hopkins and Robson families to the sport of Moto Trials and hope that your numbers grow when others are infected with your passion.

Hamilton MCC will host the NZ championships on Labour weekend in 2021 and we hope that we can duplicate the standards that were enjoyed in Canterbury this weekend. Thank you Pioneer.

2020 Honda CCMR Endurance Weekend

Report on 3 Hour Race from Chris Dyson

I spent the sunny practice day running race simulations on old tyres, getting a feel for the seldom used track 4 at BMMP. The tyres held on to consistent times even as they reached 90 laps old. The rest of the day was spent helping some of the track day riders with lines and advise on how to best attack the circuit.

Race day rolls around and we wake up to a sodden race track, a quick change to wets I head out to mixed conditions. Having not had a chance to test my Zx10-R before in the wet. I saw one of my competitors Paul Jenkins crash at turn 4 in front of me early on, so I built my way into the session slowly catching the other bikes in my heat. As my confidence grew, I was able to set a time good enough to qualify 2nd, with my team mate Jacob Stroud setting a time good enough for 3rd in his heat leaving us 3rd overall for the main event...

The shotgun sounded I ran to my bike in the Le Mans style grid I got an amazing start reaching turn one in 2nd position I battled all the way through my stint and came in for the first swap with Jacob, we got a really quick transponder change and he was away!

I got my helmet off, refuelled my bike and I heard the commentators say that Jacob had crashed having a massive high side in the last corner breaking his collarbone ending our race in the 26th minute. We had the pace to finish 5th overall and I beat my old personal best from last year by 4.6 seconds on lap 2.

Jacob's day ended with a trip for some x-rays, whilst I was lucky enough to join Mike



Sorensen as his team mate Jon Sofo had to retire due to illness the steward and CoC allowed us to join teams under the condition that we wouldn't be classified. Which suited us both to finish the day having fun and get in some solid race practice...

I have the final round of the Centenary Series coming up on the 8th of November which I'm currently sitting second behind Jaden Hassan and 1 point ahead of Matt Drayson in the Formula Auckland class. I also have the Suzuki Series in December. I hope to see you all there for the final round supporting our club in this special series.

Project 54 Racing

Report on 2 Hour Race from the Parkers

This is just about the 300 Supersport subclass, sorry didn't pay too much attention to our bigger cousins, the Pro Twins, although it was an eventful event for Dillon Telford, but that is another story.

Our first endurance race in a while, Shaun was lucky enough to team up with Campbell Grayling, one of NZ's top 300 SS riders. Shaun had a good Saturday practice before the heavens opened up in the afternoon and spoiled things. Campbell arrived in time for one dry session, and everyone pretty much hung up their boots for the rest of the afternoon.

Sunday morning qualifying was in clearer weather, but still on a very damp track, so tyre swapping was the order of the morning. Campbell slotted in a good time despite lack of practice, and Shaun testing his wets for the first time ever on a wet/dry mixed surface, got a good enough time for our team to qualify 2nd 300.

Race time was dry, Campbell was to start. Unfortunately the bike didn't fire up on the Le Mans start, so he was last away, but steadily progressed into 3rd by the time of the first rider change. Shaun then had a steady, uneventful half hour where he didn't even see another 300, before swapping back to Campbell. We were hard on the heels of the Boyds, father and son team sharing one bike. That gave us a little advantage, as they had to refuel in their pit stops. With all that Campbell managed to close within 12 seconds before changing over to Shaun for the final 25 minutes. He started well, then the clutch started slipping, causing his lap times to drop, despite him riding his best all weekend. Fearing serious damage to the bike, he pulled in, not realising he was about to take the white flag. (Note to self, organise a better pit board with more information next time...). So we sent him out for the final lap on Campbell's bike to complete the race.

Unfortunately these problems cost us the 2 lap lead we had over 4th place, crossing the line just behind them. 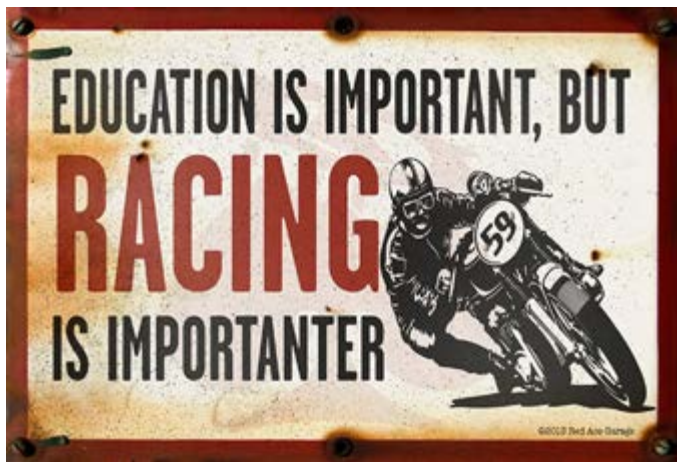

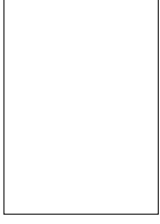
