

Off all 10 of us set off towards Whatawhata on an eclectic mix of bikes, from Steve on his 1924 AJS big port 350cc to a couple of the very latest Ducati V2 Panigales, and a real mixture of in between machinery. The dark clouds were hanging around exactly where we were heading, but as we were meeting others on the way, we were committed to the planned route (I must put my hand up here as the organizer of this ride).

It was still raining (just not as heavily now) all the way back to Hamilton where Mark had kindly been slaving away on the BBQ (thanks Mark). Once we got our wet gear off and discussed aspects of the ride (and the weather), and lots of other crap, the BBQ was a welcome way to warm up.
